

4. Financial Items:

a) The full per capita (tax \$) cost of an F-1 visa seeking student, needs to be paid at the time an I-20 form is issued. After payment is made, and if the F-1 visa is denied, the student <u>will receive a refund</u> of amount paid, less the \$100 application fee (already included in cost). Upon a written request, a refund will be given within 10 working days.

All application requirements must be completed and met, otherwise, the application will be denied.

Applications are accepted on a first come first served basis. Deadline to apply is June 15th. Once the school quota has been met, applications will be denied.

If application is approved: A letter of acceptance will be given (generally emailed) indicating payment is now due. Once payment is made, and verified, the I-20 will be completed, along with payment verification. Student is required to have the original I-20 when applying for their F-1 visa. These papers can be mailed upon request, if not picked up by a 3rd party.

Once payment is made & I-20 has been given: If the F-1 visa is denied, or the student changes their mind, the student <u>will receive a refund</u> of amount paid, less the \$100 application fee (already included in cost). Upon a written request, a refund will be processed within 10 working days.

NON-RESIDENT TUITION POLICY

53A-2-205. (2) The board shall charge the nonresident child tuition at least equal to the per capita cost of the school program in which the child enrolls. <u>The School Board cannot waive tuition for an F-1 student as per Section 625 of Public Law 104-208 in which Immigration requires F-1 students in the public school system to pay the per capita cost.</u>

As of November 30, 1996, (Section 625 of Public Law 104-208- attached) Immigration requires that <u>all</u> F-1 students in public schools throughout the United States <u>must</u> pay their per capita cost for public education.

International Students seeking graduation from a Provo District High School:

We are excited to welcome and support students seeking entrance to Provo Schools from foreign countries, this opportunity provides a cultural experience for both the incoming students as well as our District's students. When students wish to attend Provo School District High Schools for graduation, this significantly impacts the resources in our schools

Because of the time and resources demand, of students seeking graduation, Provo School District places both a cap and early application deadline on students seeking graduation. Both the cap and deadline for graduation may be adjusted from one year to the next according to the resources available in our schools. In addition to the cap and deadline there are also very strict requirements for students seeking graduation. Failure to meet any portion, or deadlines associated with the Provo School District Application, will result in instant disqualification of the student's application for entrance.

Provide evidence of completion of 9-11 grades, or 16+ credits.

_____ Attend Timpview or Provo High, as a full time student, for one school year, beginning August-May.

 Meet all 24 credits for the Utah High School, graduation requirements for
 Consideration in receiving a Provo School District, High School Diploma in the end (Month of May) of your year at Timpview or Provo High.

Credit types for a Provo School District Diploma

Only students with an equivalent to 24 year long credits earned at the end of their year-long school experience in Provo will be eligible for potential graduation. Students can earn up to a maximum of 8 credits in one year of attendance in our High Schools (See the table on FORM D page2.

PUBLIC LAW INFORMATION

From: <u>Public law 104-208</u>, Omnibus Authorization Bill for the Commerce, State and Justice departments, signed into law on September 30, 1996. The bill contained provisions entitled the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (IIRIRA). Provisions dealing with foreign students in public schools follow:

SEC. 625. FOREIGN STUDENTS.

(a) Limitations--

(1) In general -- Section 214 (8 U.S.C. 1184) is amended by adding at the end the following new subsection:

"(1)(1) An alien may not be accorded status as a nonimmigrant under section 101(a)(15)(F)(i) in order to pursue a course of study--

"(A) at a public elementary school or in a publicly funded adult education program; or

"(B) at a public secondary school unless--

"(i) the aggregate period of such status at such a school does not exceed 12 months with respect to any alien, and

"(ii) the alien demonstrates that the alien has reimbursed the local educational agency that administers the school for the full, unsubsidized per capita cost of providing education at such school for the period of the alien's attendance.

"(2) An alien who obtains the status of a nonimmigrant under section 101(a)(15)(F)(i) in order to pursue a course of study at a private elementary or secondary school or in a language training program that is not publicly funded shall be considered to have violated such status and the alien's visa under section 101(a)(15)(F) shall be void, if the alien terminates or abandons such course of study at such a school and undertakes a course of study at a public elementary school in a publicly funded adult education program, in a publicly funded adult education language training program or at a public secondary school (unless the requirements of paragraph (1)(B) are met)."

(2) Conforming amendment, -- Section 101 (a)(15)(F) (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(15)(F)) is amended by inserting "consistent with section 214(1)" after "such a course of study"

(b) Reference to New Ground of Exclusion for Student Visa Abusers. -- For addition of ground of inadmissibility for certain nonimmigrant student abusers, see section 347.

(c) Effective Date. -- The amendments made by subsection (a) shall apply to individuals who obtain the status of a nonimmigrant under section 101(a)(15)(F) of the Immigration and Nationality Act after the end of the 60-day period beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act, including aliens whose status as such a nonimmigrant is extended after the end of such period.
