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

MISSION

The mission of the Foundation is to elevate student success in the Provo City School District by funding educational opportunities for students and their teachers from community donations.

This mission is accomplished through raising funds to support a wide range of activities, including extended day programs, scholarships for students, and grants for teachers. 2018-2019 HIGHLIGHTS

Extended Day Programs

Foundation donations helped 3,748 students attend extended day programs (after-school, during-school, summer school, full-day kindergarten). 52% were from economically disadvantaged homes.

Teacher Grants

Ten grants were given to teachers in the district. With these grants, the teachers purchased materials for a variety of projects, ranging from tools and equipment for high school robotics education, to resources to teach about composers across cultures, languages, and musical styles, to eggs and equipment for kindergarten students to learn about the cycle of life while closely observing the hatching of baby chicks.

Building on Excellence Awards

The Building on Excellence Awards honored six outstanding teachers and educators for the 2018-2019 school year. They are Betty Jo Anderson (special education paraprofessional, Provo Peaks Elementary), Clay Bingham (assistant principal, Timpview High School), Robert Bunker (special education teacher, Oaks Springs), Julie Ann Porter (first grade teacher, Wasatch Elementary), Brian Preece (teacher & coach, Provo High School), and Cynthia Whatcott Ward (first grade teacher, Provost Elementary)

Camp Big Springs STEM for 5th Graders

A Provo tradition since 1969, Camp Big Springs is a STEM camp for fifth-grade students. The PCSD Foundation provided 94 scholarships this year for a total of \$9,550.


2019 GRADUATION RATES




