




Description	<p>The <i>Get Ready</i> curriculum is used with students who are at proficiency levels 1 and 2. The curriculum starts with an introduction to the English language (reading left to right, letter names, etc.). Subsequent units include phonics lessons, beginning English grammar, and an emphasis on school vocabulary. Digital (accessed through Clever) and print resources give students opportunities to practice in each domain.</p>	<p>The <i>Bridges</i> curriculum is used with students who are at proficiency levels 3 and 4 in grades 7-12. Units include literary and informational texts, grammar and language practice, and cross-curricular connections. Digital and print resources give students opportunities to practice in each domain. Digital resources are accessed through a Clever account.</p>	<p>These leveled readers could be used in small groups. Readers come in three levels. Each unit in the <i>Get Ready</i> curriculum has 4 of these leveled readers aligned to it and another core curriculum (ELA, social studies, science, and math). The Vista online platform has audio files, comprehension and vocabulary practice, and quizzes for each reader. These can be accessed through a Clever account.</p>	<p>Teachers use this program to teach students routines for reading words with more than one syllable by teaching 6 syllable types. It should be used in English Language Development 2-4 classes (once students have mastered letter sounds).</p>	<p>provopd.rosettastoneclassroom.com/</p> <p>This online platform helps students practice reading, writing, speaking, and listening in English. Lessons also include vocabulary, pronunciation, and grammar practice.
